In November, Jason Gage, our new City Manager, shared a brief history of his career and his vision for leading the city of Springfield.

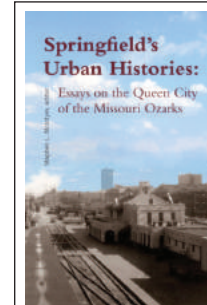


Chris Haller (center) and Kelly Turner (right), accepted the Commercial Betterment Award on behalf of the new City Utilities Transit Center.
