Captain Mark Steiger explained the Citizens on Patrol (COP) program and how that volunteer program helps the Sheriff Officers better serve the public



After sharing three trivia questions with the audience, Steiger fielded questions about such things as the timeline for the new jail, when is the best day to not get at ticket, DNA testing, mental health and whether meth is still an issue in our community.
